### AROCA WA PRESIDENT'S REPORT



At the end of the last financial year, AROCA WA conducted a survey of its membership. I was pleased to be able to report on our progress with the survey at the club's last committee meeting, held on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The club received 48 responses out of 73 AROCA WA members who were sent the survey. Highlights of the

data received from our club survey include the following:

- The majority of members who responded had been in the club for over 10 years; relatively few of our more recent members gave responses.
- The survey showed that most of our members are in the club primarily in order to meet other Alfa enthusiasts.
- It was interesting that, of the members who responded, about 50% of them are also members of other car clubs in WA.
- The data showed that social and touring events ranked as the club's most wanted events by members, although other club and technical events also ranked highly.
- Garage events are of interest to members, as are longer weekend drives.
- About half of our members wanted the club to hold more events that their partners could also attend.
- Of the gaps perceived in the club's present offering, the most requested is to have increased notice of forthcoming events. This is followed by a desire for

more technical events, more touring events, and, if possible, to have the club magazine reinstituted.

• A regular website update was requested widely in the recent survey. It was also noted that the Facebook page for AROCA WA needed updating. Please note that the correct Facebook link is https://www.facebook.com/Alfa-

- Members requested that more events be organized to be held south of the river and they asked for the publication of an annual calendar of events.
- Of the members who did respond to the survey, I noted that most are over 60, and that every survey responder is over 46. We are members of a mature club!

In response to the results of the survey, it was agreed at our last committee meeting that the committee will endeavor to organize a monthly club run day (e.g., every 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month). Details have yet to be determined. However, everyone on the committee has agreed to take on a coordination role, on top of their committee roles. (See responsibilities shown against future events in a table provided later in this newsletter.)

In reading this newsletter, you will note that this year's program has also been mapped out - perhaps only provisionally for those future events that are further into 2017.

As the Club's President, I believe that, based on our survey results, there is a clear need to enlarge AROCA WA. Therefore, I would like to set us an end of year target of over 100 financial members, although, I do note that as of September 23<sup>rd</sup>, there were only 54 currently paid-up current members, plus six life members.

The committee is aware that the club reached 84 members during the 2015/16 financial year. Therefore, we will check on a list of lapsed members as part of our club growth objective.

The committee agreed to consider how to set up electronic payments for future events using a feature such as a Paypal account on the website. You may have noted that for the pasta run, we adopted the Fiat Club's electronic payment system. Depending upon our success with this system for the Pasta Run, we may continue this approach, or look at alternatives such at EventBrite to notify events and collect payments via the web.

Everyone, please note that there is a need to update the list of concessional vehicles supported by the club and use that to advise the CMC. This list needs to be cross-referenced with the current paid-up membership list. As a result, we have set up an email circulation to all current (and recent past) members to request that they advise us at AROCA WA regarding their ownership of any WA-registered concessional vehicle.

You may have noted that the formal logo of Alfa Romeo has recently changed. As a result, all AROCA-related club materials in the various states are being updated. Please note the new logo is shown in the footer below.

A new internet club shop provider has been established for AROCA in NSW and Victoria and we are looking at AROCA WA arrangements currently. At the last committee meeting, we agreed that, given the outdating of old stock due to this logo change, the club will sell off/liquidate all of its old stock in the near future.

Lastly, please note that our next club events are as follows:

- On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, there is the combined Italian car clubs' **annual pasta run** which ends at the Italian club for lunch. If you haven't booked already, please note that registration details are shown on a following page in this newsletter.
- On Saturday, 13<sup>th</sup> November, Rotary will hold an Italian car day at Gloucester
  - Park. The Café and restaurant there will be open all day on the 13<sup>th</sup>. A formal lunch for Italian car clubs is also planned that day.
- Our Christmas function will be held on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December. The club has agreed that this year's Christmas function be made free to current members. The club will hold a run to the venue for a late lunch of "Pizzas in the Park" at Dominic Zito's.
- Our competition program also has two scheduled events for the rest of this year. The Vintage Stampede on 26<sup>th</sup> November and the CAMS Sprint on 3<sup>rd</sup> December. Both events will be at the Barbagallo Raceway. Check with our competition secretary, John Reed, for details. Please also note



#### Got one of these?

This 105 series Spider 1600 "Duetto" prototype was fitted out by Pininfarina at the end of 1965. Streamlined rear wheel passage, wire wheels, and raised sections behind the seats (over the boot) can be seen. Interestingly, the final 1966 first production version of the Duetto did not have these prototype features.
