


WA ALFA CLUB NEWS & UPCOMING EVENTS SUMMARY

SOME RECENT ALFA ROMEO AUCTIONS IN EUROPE

A few recently published auction results for Alfa Romeos (etc.) appear below, as reported in the electronic edition of Keith Martin's Sports Car Market newsletter for July 2019.



1963 LAMBORGHINI 1R custom tractor. S/N 15447. Light blue & orange/light blue painted steel. MHD. Announced on the block, as I had discovered during inspection (with the aid of one of the world's foremost authorities on Lambo tractors), that the engine is from an earlier tractor, a 1958 Lamborghinetta DL20. Transmission/rear-axle assembly is from a 1963 model 2241 R, which is a 3-speed with high-low range. Also fitted with a post-1963 tubular front axle. Repaint is closer to Gulf Oil colours than to the correct Lambo colours (but only for the back half, as a Lamborghinetta

was originally red and grey). Incorrect 1R decals, Lights, wiring harness (actually the whole electrical system) and the exhaust are incorrectly painted blue. Sloppy stitch welding on light brackets. Parts-bin generator and gauges. Orange cargo strap cut off and used for the hood retainer. All tires are new. Cond: 3. **SOLD AT \$12,306.** *To put this tractor in Lamborghini car terms, it would be like having a Diablo with a Jalpa's V8 engine plopped into it. How many folks would be lined up to buy that? Still, this looks pretty if you wanted a Lambo tractor to go with your Lambo car and had more dollars than sense. Part of the problem is that there is just as much BS as correct information out there (especially on the interweb), but the truth is out there (even if it helps to be conversant in Italian) and it's getting better. The bidding opened at €3k. I wasn't the only person there to give this a wide berth—most of the folks with bidder's paddles did too. At its final amount, nobody went off the deep end financially. Better and worse examples have brought more, but this bitzer will look pretty in someone's man-cave.*



1964 ALFA ROMEO GIULIA SS coupe. S/N AR381099. Red/black leather. Odometer reads 22,954 miles. High-quality paint with no obvious flaws. Chrome bumpers show surface scratches and are a little hazy, but the rest of its exterior trim is good. Glass clear all around. Steel wheels with hubcaps are blemish-free. Stance looks good with newish Vredestein Sprint tires. New black leather seat covers with red piping are unworn. Clear plastic bug deflector installed at back of hood. Stock engine bay appears clean and detailed. Equipped with Veloce specification engine and front disc brakes. Includes

original Carta Di Circolazi- one booklet, instruction manual and Alfa Romeo Storico certificate. Cond: 2. **SOLD AT \$89,650.** *Despite its polarizing looks, this car provides a drag coefficient of 0.28, which is impressive even by today's standards. The catalogue states that this example arrived in USA in 1980 and was the recipient of a bare-metal respray and a comprehensive mechanical overhaul in 2010. An impressive example that participated in the 2010 Concorso Italiano, winning the award for the Best 101-Series Alfa Romeo. This car sold on eBay back in 2005 before restoration for US\$41,100. It was noted that the price realized on eBay was market correct for the time. This car has been driven 1,652 miles since and the sale price here was under the money in today's market. Well bought.*



ALFA ROMEO GIULIA SS coupe. S/N AR381350.

Silver/black vinyl & cloth. Repainted 1999, was red. Motor is from a Giulia TI (AR0051444923) wearing tubular manifold, aftermarket air filters and engine stabilizer bar. Rear bumper is a bit wavy, as is the body around the air intake. Cloth seat facings are rather baggy, but not unduly worn. Unused since 2010, and its clutch is said to stick intermittently. Cond: 3+. **SOLD AT US\$68,841.** *Ca was previously in the USA, where it may have been raced. Then it went to the U.K. and into the*

Abba Kogan Collection in 1991 via a Christie's sale for US\$50,146 (SCM# 6829354). Not a huge amount of money for an SS, but it's not the sharpest either.



1964 ALFA ROMEO 2600 Spider. S/N AR852057.

White/red cloth/red leather. RHD. Odometer reading is 44,032 miles. It is one of 103 right-handers. Older (2008–10) restoration, but still very good and it is very clean underneath. Leather redone at some time; it is deep, rich and just taking on a bit of life; new carpets, top looks new **SOLD AT US\$162,849.** *Sold just over high estimate, but still very good value compared with a Maser 3500GT Spyder or even a DB4 ragtop.*

1955 ALFA ROMEO 1900 CSS

This article about the 1900 series Alfa Romeos has been mainly extracted from Wikipedia.



The Alfa Romeo 1900 was produced from 1950 to 1959. This vehicle series was first designed by [Orazio Satta](#). It became an important development for Alfa Romeo as the first car built entirely on a [production line](#). It was also Alfa's first production car produced without a separate chassis and was initially introduced at the [Paris Motor Show](#) of 1950.

The first offerings of the 1900 were two-door or four-door models, with a new 1,884 cc (bore 82.55mm, stroke 88mm), 90 bhp (67 kW), 4-cylinder twin-cam engine. The 1900 was spacious and simple, yet quick and sporty. The slogan Alfa used in its marketing was "the family car that wins races", alluding unsubtly to the car's success at Targa Florio, Stella Alpina, and in other competitions.



In 1951, the short wheelbase 1900C ("c for corto - i.e., Italian for short) version was introduced. It had a wheelbase of 2,500mm. In the same year, the **1900TI**, with a more powerful 100 bhp (75 kW) engine was introduced, with bigger valves, a higher compression ratio and equipped with a double carburettor. Two years later, the **1900 Super** and **1900 TI Super** (also the 1900 Super Sprint) emerged with a 1,975cc engine (bore increased to 84.5mm, stroke unchanged). The TI Super had two double carburettors and 115 bhp (86 kW). Transmission was via a 4-speed manual on the basic versions, but with a 5-speed manual in the Super Sprint version. The brakes were drum brakes and the 1900 had independent front suspension and a [live rear axle](#).



Production at the company's Milan plant continued until 1959 with 21,304 1900s being built, including 17,390 saloons.

The chassis of the 1900 was designed specifically to permit [coachbuilders](#) to rebody it; the most notable of which was the [Zagato](#)-designed, 1900 Super Sprint Coupé, i.e., the vehicle shown adjacent on this page. This car had an improved engine and a custom body design.



Iginio Alessio, the then general manager of Alfa Romeo, was concerned about the viability of the independent Italian coachbuilding industry with the advent of the unibody chassis design. He wondered whether it would threaten to put the *carrozzerie* out of business. Alessio was also a personal friend of Gaetano Ponzoni co-owner of Carrozzeria Touring Superleggera. Thus, from 1951 to 1958, he arranged for Alfa Romeo to build five different variations of the 1900 unibody chassis, specifically for independent coachbuilders.



Alfa Romeo gave official contracts to Touring to build the sporty 1900 Sprint Coupé and to Pinin Farina to build an elegant four seat Cabriolet and Coupé. The availability of a suitable chassis also led to many other coach-built versions of the 1900.

For example, Carrozzeria Zagato built a small series of coupés with the unofficial designation of 1900 SSZ, designed for racing with an aerodynamic lightweight aluminium body and Zagato's trademark double bubble roof.

One-off specials were numerous from the famous Bertone BAT series of aerodynamic studies (see photo below), to an infamous sci-fi like Astral spider designed by Carrozzeria Boneschi for Rafael Trujillo, who was then the dictator of the Dominican Republic.

There was a Barchetta or "Boat Car" made by Ghia-Aigle in Lugano, Switzerland. It was designed by Giovanni Michelotti at the behest of a wealthy Italian who had two passions: 'Riva' boats and a woman, his mistress. That Boat Car had no doors or windscreen wipers.



In 1954, Alfa Romeo built two spiders and two coupés using a similar chassis as the C52 Disco Volante. (See photo above).

Around the same time, Bertone, with Franco Scaglione, designed two unique aluminium bodies, a coupé and a spider.

The coupé was known as the 2000 Sportiva. It weighed just 910 kg and had 138 horsepower (103 kW).




